- The criteria below will be considered in selecting the Sally Tagney Star Student Award winner:

Academic - achieves scholastically across a range of subjects

Attitude - is committed to excellence, willing to help others, makes selfless contributions

Conduct - is exemplary at all times

Leadership - is a role model to other students

Service - participates in school and community activities

Sport - represents the school without necessarily being a champion.
