

SCHOLASTIC AWARDS

WHO SHOULD RECEIVE THESE AWARDS?

Many school awards acknowledge students' achievements within a particular area in the class room, on the sports fields or in the community. As its name suggests, the Academic Extra-Curricular Participation Awards recognises students who have participated in Academic Extra-Curricular activities as part of their school life.

Point allocation for participation in an event is based on participation in the events and the level of achievement in that event.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- The students will come from the Years 3 - 6 cohorts each year.
- The students will have their participation and level of achievement recorded in OneSchool Extra-Curricular activities by the administration staff.
- Students will be responsible for ensuring that the correct information is relayed to the administration staff for recording.
- The events listed below is not an exhaustive list and can be added to each year depending of what events are offered to the school and its students.
- The criteria below will be used in the allocation of points for these awards:
Individual Points may be gained for the following activities

1. UNSW test
 - a. Participation – 1 point
 - b. Credit – 2 points
 - c. Distinction or High Distinction – 3 points
2. LOTE speaking contest
 - a. Participant – 1 point
 - b. Finalist/Winner – 2 points
3. School Spelling Bee
 - a. Participant – 1 point
 - b. Finalist/Winner – 2 points
4. Interschool Chess
 - a. Participant – 1 point
 - b. Finalist/Winner – 2 points
5. Premier Reading Challenge
 - a. Participant – 1 point
6. Readers Cup
 - a. Participant – 1 point
 - b. Winner – 2 points

Team events that require a commitment of personal time will gain the following points:

1. Interschool Debating
 - a. Participation – 10 points
2. Optiminds
 - a. Participant – 7 points
 - b. Regional Honour – 10 points
 - c. Regional Winners – 12 points
3. Macdonald Maths Tournament
 - a. Participant – 5 points
 - b. Regional Winners – 8 points

PARTICIPATION AWARDS

Bronze Awards – These certificates are presented to students who have earned a minimum of 7 points up to a maximum of 11

Silver Awards – These certificates are presented to students who have earned a minimum of 12 points up to a maximum of 16

Gold Awards – These certificates are presented to students who have earned a minimum of 17 points.
