WHO SHOULD RECEIVE THE SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD?

Many school awards acknowledge students' achievements within a particular area in the class room, on the sports fields or in the community. As its name suggests, the Special Achievement Award recognises a student who achieves in a number of areas; specifically related to Individual Education Plan Goals. These can include academic studies, communication skills, social situation skills, Gross motor skills and any other IEP goals. Awardees are characterised by their commitment to doing their best in working towards achievement of their goals.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- The student will come from Years 3 – 6 cohorts each year.
- The student will be selected by a committee made up of the current SEU teachers (including the HOSES, **one** Specialist teacher (either HPE, Music, LOTE, Librarian or Learning Support teacher) and the Principal/Deputy
- The criteria below will be considered in selecting the Special Achievement Awardee:

Academic - achieves all academic IEP goals

Attitude - is committed to improvement, willing to make an effort to constantly improve

Conduct – reflex the set IEP goals

Service - participates in school and community activities

Sport/Cultural – involves themselves where possible
