Mackay North State School considers that all areas of our school are teaching and learning environments. We consider behaviour management to be an opportunity for valuable social learning as well as a means of maximising the success of academic education programs.

Our **Student Code of Conduct** outlines our system for facilitating positive behaviours, preventing inappropriate and unacceptable behaviours and responding to these behaviours. This ensures that our expectations for student behaviour are plain to everyone, assisting our school to create and maintain a positive and productive teaching and learning environment.

At all times, Mackay North State School seeks to reflect the values and behaviours that are acceptable in our society. We have a clear expectation that, as far as possible, we remain connected to the community that exists outside the school fence and that our students will embrace the appropriate values as their preferred way of behaving. These beliefs influence their decisions, behaviour and social practices.

It is reasonable to expect that not everyone will share the same sets of beliefs, and this contributes to a richly diverse social environment in each school. It can also contribute to differences in expectations and force us to reflect on our own understanding of what we consider acceptable and unacceptable. We encourage any student or parent to make an appointment with the principal to discuss the model of behaviour support and discipline used at this school.

#### **NAPLAN**

As children progress through their school years, it is important that checks are made along the way to see how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and mathematics – skills that will set them upon the path to success as adults. NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress.

Over the last week all students in Years 3 and 5 have had the opportunity to participate in a practice NAPLAN test which is being completed online this year. Students in Years 3 and 5 will complete the NAPLAN tests between the 11<sup>th</sup> May and 21<sup>st</sup> May.

### **ATTENDANCE**

While we continue to give the message around the importance of education and attending school every day, we continue to see a percentage of students who have frequent days off or are consistently late to school. Punctual and regular attendance at school is critical for student outcomes. Unless a child is unwell then they should attend school. Not only does it provide them with optimal opportunities for improving their academic achievement but it also develops other areas such as organisational skills, social interaction and development, communication and teamwork skills and resilience. ### **SMART Reading Tips for the Holidays**

It comes as no surprise that children love school holidays! Being free of the restraints of going to school every day and being able to relax is a valuable part of growing up. The regular reading that is a part of many children's school day suddenly comes to an end as there are far more interesting things to do on vacation than read a book, right? With holidays right around the corner, use these tips for keeping kids engaged in learning and reading over the Easter break.

**Read for fun!** Whether your child is in the mood for holiday stories or the newest instalment from a favourite series, holidays provide the perfect opportunity to set aside school books and read for fun. Make time for bedtime stories to create the routine and enjoy books on a daily basis.

**Stock up on books at the local library**. Help your child pick out books they're interested in reading. Libraries may also have fun, free holiday activities throughout the break.

**Make the most of travel time**. Turn travel time to or from a holiday get-together into an opportunity to practice reading.

You can:

- look for license plates from different states
- try to find the alphabet on the number plates
- count the number of red (or white or green) cars you see
- read street signs and billboards you see along the way

**Have a 'screen free night' each week.** Make a screen free night part of your family's regular routine where everyone in the family picks up something to read. Having your children see you read and talk about books adds value to this reading time. Another approach to the screen free night may be to invest in reading lamps or book lights so that children can read in bed before sleep.

#### Fun in the kitchen.

- a) Simple recipes, like pancakes, provide your child with some 'hands on' reading and learning how to follow a series of steps.
- b) Let them pretend that the kitchen is a café where they can order from a 'menu' that they have written (e.g. milkshakes, biscuits, fruit, crackers etc)

**Create a new tradition**. A little predictability is comforting for kids. Starting a special holiday Story Time can be a new tradition that links reading with happy memories.

Remember, you don't have to be an expert to help your child with reading. By simply interacting with children around books, you can show them that books are important and worthy of our attention.
